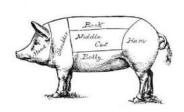

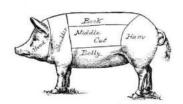

BOARD REPORT: COMMON GROUNDS

We are in full swing for the season as we work on a number of projects in the neighborhood.

My hope is that the Valley Street entrance project is complete by the time this newsletter is published. We have made some minor (or maybe not so minor) changes to the layout as the landscapers began the planting process. We did not like the location of some of the trees and larger plantings once we saw them in place. In a couple of instances we even changed the plant selection, which required the landscapers to order different items for us and delay completion. If the economy is stagnant you would never know it based on how busy landscapers and other contractors are at this time of the year! I think the final product will really help make Fox Point look incredible, especially in the coming years as the plantings start to mature.

The fence repair at the Valley entrance is also still a work in progress. As luck would have it, that fence was discontinued a few years back and we can no longer get replacement sections. At first pass the fence vendors told me that we either needed to replace 100% of the fences on those walls with a new version or custom build new sections in order to complete the repair. Both options were very expensive and not practical so we continue to research other options. My hope is that the fence will be repaired as we complete the landscaping.

This year we are adding seasonal plantings to new flower pots at the pool house entrance. It should really complete the pool entrance. I have been told that I am nuts for putting these up there as no one will water them or take care of them over the summer season. In the spirit of being nuts, I ask that if you are up at the pool and see that my pots of flowers are in need of some love, please feel free to add some water, pick out the dead flowers, talk to them, or do whatever you feel is necessary to keep them looking nice. If you have pulled your kids out of the pool for a few minutes due to bad behavior, send them up to water the flower pots as part of their punishment. Just thinking outside of the box! Any assistance would be helpful.

We completed the tree removal project at lot D and I hope to have the guys out to trim the trees at the pool, tennis court, and boat dock areas very soon. The path/asphalt sealing projects will also move forward once the school district completes their repair of the path that leads from the south side of Fox Point to the school complex. They told me that it is on their list but cannot tell me when it will be completed.

The landscapers did a very poor job in the seeding repair this spring so they will be back out in full force in the coming weeks to better complete this task at all of the common areas of Fox Point – pool, tennis court area, boat dock area, across the street from the boat dock area, as well as a couple of the islands.

As always, if you see something that needs to be addressed, please let me know. As an FYI, we do budget in the fall each year for monies to be spent the next calendar year, so most of our projects and expenses are already fixed for this year. I am starting to look forward towards next year as I am putting together a potential to do list for 2017 projects.

BOARD REPORT: LAKE

Water Testing & Observations

Henri Kokke and I met with Lake County in May to go over the level 2 water quality testing procedure. Once a month we will be taking water samples from the middle of Lake Louise and sending them to the Illinois EPA for review. This will give us some benchmark data on things like phosphorus levels and suspended solids that we have normally only received in Lake County study years. It also gives us a good excuse to enjoy Lake Louise.

Our initial Secchi disk readings indicate that the water has an average visibility of a little over one foot. This is not great news, but is consistent with previous years (around this time). Low visibility means that plants have a hard time growing. That said we have seen a good amount of Curly Leaf and Sago pondweed along the shorelines. Although Curly Leaf is an invasive type of plant, we will take whatever growth we can get to consume some of the nutrients in the lake. Curly Leaf (a brown reddish weed with curled leaves) will die off as the water gets warmer.

Treatment

Environmental Aquatic Management (EAM) has completed two chemical treatments so far this year. As it gets warmer, the treatment frequency will go up. The bubblers are operational and currently there are no standing algae to contend with.

Do you recognize this picture?



This is Flint Creek looking into Lake Louise on the cut through connection on Surrey between Lake Shore and Valley. It looks its best in the fall, but the native plants are growing in and making it a fantastic scenic spot on the lake. The next time you are on a walk, stop and enjoy the park bench and view. The Flint Creek shorelines are managed by the HOA for plant life and erosion control. You will see some minor activity from time to time this summer to help preserve this asset.

BOARD REPORT: POOL

There was plenty of activity at the pool over the holiday weekend and our wonderful amenity was enjoyed by many.

Please remember to stop by the pool and turn in your homeowner info sheet (attached). Each family member is required to have an identification photograph on an information sheet that will be maintained at the pool office. Homeowners are required to complete the information sheet prior to entering the pool. Persons entering the pool area are to check in with the staff attendant each visit to verify membership.

Lap Swimming:

New this year -- at the request of many swimmers -- we will have lap swimming available Monday – Friday from 12:30 - 2 p.m. There will be multiple lanes to accommodate more swimmers. The lane lines will come out from 2 – 6 p.m. to allow for more games to be played in the diving area. Two lanes will be available from 6 p.m-close. This is something we are testing and we may make adjustments to the schedule. We will post a lap swimming schedule at the pool entry office. Also, please note that you are welcome to swim on Tuesday and Thursday mornings from 6 a.m.-7:30 a.m. with the Masters program.

Team Sports:

Swim and Water Polo practice start this week, the first week of June. Swim practice runs from 8 -11 a.m. If you have a toddler under the age of 5 you are welcome to visit the wading pool in the morning during swim practice. You must clear the pool along with the swimmers at 11 a.m. to allow for time to prepare the pool for the day. All children at the wading pool must be supervised at all times without exception.

A few reminders:

- Please remember that break time is not the time for our older swimmers to run over and use the wading pool. Only children under the age of 5 are allowed in the wading pool and must be supervised by someone over the age of 14. Lifeguards will be monitoring this throughout the day.
- Children under 8 years of age must be accompanied at all times by a responsible person, 14 years or older.
- Children 8 to 12 must be accompanied by a responsible person, 14 years or older, until they pass the swimming test.
- Please do not bring any glass to the pool.
- All guest must be accompanied by a home owner. Guest fees are \$5 for non-residents.
